THE 4th ETHNOSPORT FORUM WAS HELD IN A HYBRID FORMAT

The 4th Ethnosport Forum, organized by the World Ethnosport Confederation (WEC) with the theme “Reviving Traditional Sports,” was held in a hybrid format on April 10 due to the global pandemic.

Nearly 300 participants from 61 countries participated online in the forum; A panel was also held under the chairmanship of WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan and the participation of ministers of youth and sports from six countries.

The Ethnosport Forum Was Held in a Hybrid Format This Year

Organized for the 4th time this year, the Ethnosport Forum was held in a hybrid format on April 10 due to the global pandemic. The forum, which participants followed from a digital platform specially prepared for them, attracted great attention. In addition to WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan, Gambia's Youth and Sports Minister Bakary Y. Badji, Qatar's Culture and Sports Minister Salah bin Ghanem Al Ali, Mali's Youth and Sports Minister Mossa Ag Attaher, Minister of Youth and Sports of the Republic of Serbia Vanja Udovičić, Somali's Youth and Sports Minister Hamza Said Hamza, and Turkey's Youth and Sports Minister Mehmet Muharrem Kasapoğlu, close to 300 people from 61 countries attended the forum, in which President of the Republic of Turkey Recep Tayyip Erdoğan participated by way of a video message. United Nations Deputy Secretary General Maimunah Mohd Sharif attended the Forum with a live link, while Polish Minister of Sports and Tourism Anna Krupka and UNESCO Deputy Director of Social and Human Sciences Gabriela Ramos also got involved with their video messages.

President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan: “Traditional Values and Sports Will Come into Prominence”

Participating in the 4th Ethnosport Forum via video message, President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan emphasized the impact the epidemic has had on societies and stated, “Through the pandemic, we have seen the importance of not only health and healthy living but also of solidarity, sharing, and traditional values. The dominant mentality that glorifies individuality, ignores spirituality, and despises traditional values has deepened the problems caused by the epidemic. In the world that will be reshaped post-pandemic, I believe that traditional sports and the culture and values represented by these sports will come into greater prominence.” Referring to the importance of the forum, Erdogan said, “The discussions to be held within the scope of this important forum through the participation of more than 60 countries will support and guide us in our struggle to keep alive traditional sport branches in the world and the culture and values these sports represent.”

WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan: “The Ethnosport Forum Strengthens Our Bonds”

Emphasizing the 4th Ethnosport Forum’s strengthening of intercultural bonds, WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan said, “Reviving cultural values is a powerful step for carrying the societies we live within forward. As the World Ethnosport Confederation, our aim is not only to preserve traditional sports, but also to preserve traditions such as the music and crafts around these cultures. In this regard, the Ethnosport Forum is an opportunity to strengthen our bonds. We must use our talents and energy to unite around traditional sports.”

Youth and Sports Minister Dr. Mehmet Muharrem Kasapoğlu: “We Must Keep Our Cultural Heritage Alive”

Emphasizing the important position the 4th Ethnosport Forum has in keeping cultural heritage alive, Dr. Mehmet Muharrem Kasapoğlu said, “We should convey our cultural heritage to our young people by experiencing and keeping it alive. As the Ministry of Youth and Sports, we are increasing our efforts night and day toward the reviving traditional sports and support the efforts done in this field. We believe the Ethnosport Forum has an important place in keeping our cultural heritage alive.”

The Panel was Held with the Participation of Ministers from 6 Countries

At the forum, Ministers from Gambia, Qatar, Mali, Serbia, Somalia and Turkey participated in the Forum interested in the panel, in which WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan chaired the session, presented their contributions on the topic “A New Source of Motivation for Youths during COVID-19 and Beyond: Traditional Sports and Games.”

Joint Ministerial Statement has been Signed

At the forum, WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan, Gambia's Youth and Sports Minister Bakary Y. Badjie, Qatar's Culture and Sports Minister Salah bin Ghanem al Ali, and Youth and Sports Minister of the Republic of Serbia Vanja Udovičić signed the joint declaration for the reviving traditional sports.

Held online, the panel was attended by ministers, government officials, federation representatives, and academicians from 61 countries. Throughout the forum, experts in their fields made important contributions to the future of traditional sports. Participants followed the 4th Ethnosport Forum in 6 different languages on a digital platform dedicated to them. Badjie, Qatar’s Minister of Culture and Sports Salah bin Ghanem al Ali, and Minister of the Youth and Sports of the Republic of Serbia Vanja Udovičić along with WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan signed the Joint Ministerial Statement for the national and international development, support, and popularization of Traditional Sports.



THE 3RD TRADITIONAL SPORTS AWARDS HAVE FOUND THEIR OWNERS

Organized in order to honor the people, institutions, and organizations that contribute to traditional sports and games and to announce their work in all countries of the world, the 3rd Traditional Sports Awards have gone to their recipients.

The awards were handed out in six categories: Academician, Experienced Athlete, Young Athlete, Statesman, International Sponsor, and Traditional Sports Organization.

The awards were presented by the ministers of sports who were present at the ceremony, accompanied by WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan.

In the Academician Award, Tunisian Prof. Dr. Ezzedine Bouzid was given the award for successful studies in the field of traditional sports.

Receiving his award from WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan and Turkey's Youth and Sports Minister Mehmet Muharrem Kasapoğlu, Bouzid briefly mentioned his studies in the speech he gave and conveyed his thanks to the World Ethnosport Confederation for their incentives in this area.

Somalia's Youth and Sports Minister Hamza Said Hamza presented an award to Tsogthuu Shavirai, a horseback archery athlete from Mongolia, and Mali's Youth and Sports Minister Mossa Ag Attaher presented Dinara Hallyyeva from Turkmenistan with the Young Athlete Award.

The Statesman Award, the fourth and final individual award category, was given to Salah bin Ghanem Al Ali, Qatar's Minister of Culture and Sports.

For the category of organization, the Traditional Sports Organization Award was given to the Mexican Traditional and Autochthonous Games and Sports Federation.

The president of the association, Anna Claudia Collado Garcíawho was present at the ceremony on behalf of the institution, received the award from the Youth and Sports Minister of the Republic of Serbia Vanja Udovic.

As the sixth and final category, the International Sponsor Award was presented to Türk Telekom.



A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR COOPERATION IN PROMOTION OF TRADITIONAL SPORTS WAS SIGNED.

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed among the World Ethnosport Confederation (WEC), the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat), and the Ministry of Youth and Sports of the Republic of Turkey for cooperation in safeguard and promotion of traditional sports in the context of the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda and the New Urban Agenda of the United Nations.

WEC President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan, UN-Habitat Executive Director Ms. Maimunah Mohd Sharif, and Deputy Minister of Youth and Sports Hamza Yerlikaya signed the Memorandum.

Signed at the WEC headquarters in Istanbul, the Memorandum aims to provide a framework for cooperation among the signatories for the promotion of traditional sports and games. The signatories will contribute to the setting-up of a traditional sports platform which will bring together representation from ethnosports experts, youth, the Ministry of Youth and Sports of the Republic of Turkey, the UN-Habitat and WEC.

In addition, the parties pursue opportunities to implement joint actions for safeguarding and promoting traditional sports and games as a driver of cultural heritage in the domains of education (training teachers, developing schools, programs), leisure or tourism (festivals), research (seminars, conferences, publications) of mutual interests.

Finally, the Memorandum of Understanding will aim at improving capacity, in particular by working on the introduction of traditional sports and games into school programs, by sharing knowledge and experiences.
