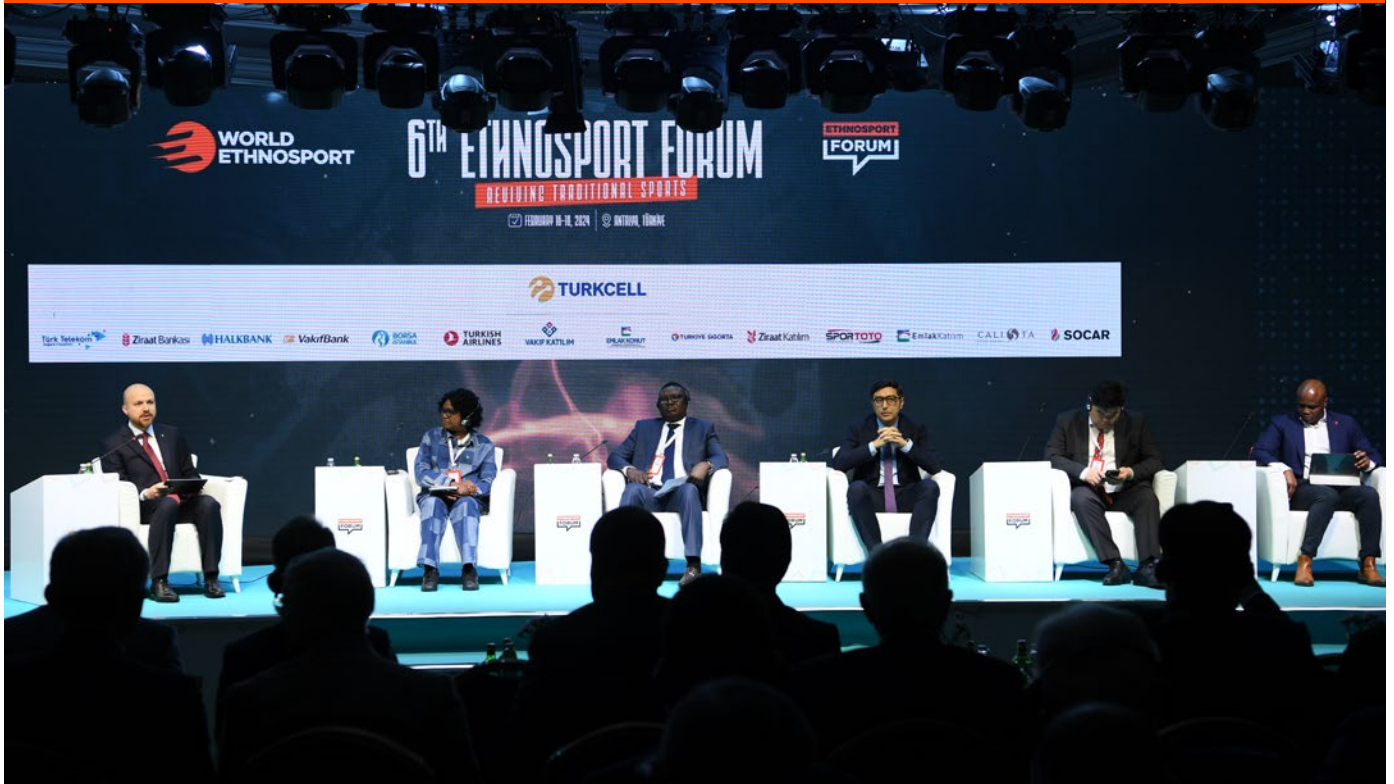
5TH WORLD NOMAD GAMES STRATEGY MEETING WAS HELD

The 5th World Nomad Games Strategy Meeting was held as an important step before the event to be held in Astana, the capital of Kazakhstan. The meeting was held at the World Ethnosport Confederation Headquarters and hosted by Confederation President Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan.

Among the prominent figures attending the meeting were Kazakhstan's Deputy Minister of Tourism and Sports Zharasbayev Serik Maratovich, Consul General in Istanbul Nuriddin Amankul and Chairman of the 5th World Nomad Games Organizing Committee Nail Nurov. At this strategic meeting, ways of cooperation in the organization and promotion of the event, which will be held from September 8 to 14, were discussed.

The event aims to keep alive and promote various cultures and traditions from around the world. The meeting focused on media and promotion strategies for the event to reach a wider audience in the international arena. The 5th World Nomad Games will feature a wide range of events, from traditional nomadic sports to music and art performances.

The meeting is considered as an important step taken by Kazakhstan to strengthen its tourism and sports diplomacy in the international arena. The success of the 5th World Nomad Games is seen as an important opportunity to further raise the country's international profile in these areas.



6TH ETHNOSPORT FORUM WAS HELD IN ANTALYA

The 6th Ethnosport Forum, held in Antalya on February 16-18 this year, was held with the theme of "Revival of Traditional Sports" and hosted 200 participants from 60 countries. The Forum started with opening speeches and panels, sessions and various activities were held on the future of traditional sports.

The Forum took place with the high-level participation of sports ministers and officials from Azerbaijan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Ghana, Guinea, Sierra Leone, Chad, Democratic Congo, Russia, Namibia, Turkey and other countries. A joint declaration was signed for the revival of traditional sports, which was signed by the President of the World Ethnosport Confederation Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan and sports ministers of many countries.

On the first day of the forum, after the opening speeches, a high-level Ministerial Panel was organized and the future of traditional sports was discussed. On the second day, a communication panel was organized and communication strategies of traditional sports were discussed. In addition, a goodwill agreement was signed, which is an important step for the promotion and protection of traditional sports.

The declaration prepared as a result of the panels and sessions held during the forum was announced to the whole world on the second day of the forum. In addition, the World Ethnosport Confederation and Kazakhstan signed a cooperation agreement for the 5th World Nomad Games. Traditional sports awards were also presented at this forum.

Cooperation for the World Nomad Games

The World Ethnosport Confederation and the Kazakhstan Organizing Committee of the World Nomad Games signed a cooperation agreement.

The agreement aims to combine the resources and efforts of both sides for the successful organization of the 5th World Nomad Games. This agreement will allow for a more comprehensive and impressive organization of the event.

The signing of the agreement was attended by Nail Nurov on behalf of the Kazakhstan Organizing Committee of the World Nomad Games and Abdulhalim Aksu on behalf of the World Ethnosport Confederation.

Joint Support for Cultural Heritage from Ethnosport Forum

The 6th Ethnosport Forum was held in Antalya under the leadership of the World Ethnosport Confederation (WEC) to protect and promote traditional sports and cultural heritage. More than 200 participants from 60 countries came together at the forum and a roadmap was determined to shape the future of traditional sports.

The most remarkable development of the forum was the goodwill agreement signed between WEC and member federations. This agreement aims to strengthen cooperation between cultural communities at the global level by setting common rules and principles for the protection and promotion of traditional sports.

The Ethnosports Forum is considered as an important step for the protection and promotion of cultural heritage around the world. The signed agreement underlines the importance of traditional sports by supporting cultural diversity and the solidarity of cultural communities.

ETHNOSPORT AT SCHOOL

Ethnosports Halls were established in 20 schools in Istanbul within the scope of the "Ethnosport at School!" project. Ethnosports Halls were opened to the use of students as of February 14, 2024. The installation of these halls was completed in 20 schools in total. 900 students from schools within the project participated in various activities at the Ethnosports Experience Center. In addition, approximately 200 teachers participating in the project received training on traditional sports and games. The closing ceremony of the project and the opening ceremony of the Ethnosports Halls was held on March 3, 2024 at Tuzla Mimar Sinan Primary School. Istanbul Development Agency representatives also attended the ceremony.



"INTER-CIVILIZATIONAL CULINARY ARTS FROM ANATOLIA" PROJECT WAS REALIZED IN BOSNIA HERZEGOVINA

The project titled "A3 Mobility (Balkan Eastern Mediterranean Cuisine and Ottoman Influence)" aims to explore and share the rich culinary culture with the slogan "Culinary Arts from Anatolia among Civilizations" for Europe. In this context, the project was held in Bosnia and Herzegovina between May 9-17, 2024. The event, which took place with the participation of Spain, Lithuania, Norway, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Turkey, focused on Balkan and Eastern Mediterranean cuisine and addressed Ottoman influences.

Hundreds of athletes representing different countries participate in the festival where traditional sports, traditional arts, universal tastes and beautiful children's games of different countries are performed." Stating that the most beautiful part of the festival is the children, Mr. Erdoğan said: "Thousands of children find the opportunity to discover their own traditions at this festival. Children play traditional games, enjoy shooting arrows and riding horses. This year, we will have special activities for our children in our festival area. While having fun with traditional games, children will also be able to participate in beautiful activities in art workshops specially prepared for them. We approach this festival with the sensitivity of 'Every child has the right to play'. We advocate that every child has the right to play wherever they are in the world. Israel's massacres of children from Gaza to Rafah since October 7 are never acceptable. The Convention on the Rights of the Child, adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on November 20, 1989 and entered into force on September 2, 1990, was signed within the framework of children's right to life and development. Israel has violated this convention many times by committing massacres, disregarding the lives of hundreds of thousands of innocent people, disregarding all kinds of rules and most importantly all humanity. We will continue to defend a world where children laugh and play to the fullest. Our festival will be a festival where children laugh and play games."

Special events, competitions and stage performances for disadvantaged groups added color to the festival. Accessible opportunities were offered to disadvantaged groups with hippotherapy, visually impaired mangala tournament, workshops and events where disabled artists performed.

In the Solidarity Obası, which was established in the festival area, attention was drawn to the February 6 Kahramanmaraş earthquake, while awareness raising activities were carried out on the massacre committed by Israel in Palestine since October 7.

Hundreds of Stage Performances

During the 4-day festival, dozens of performances were staged and many teams such as Turkish World Music and Dance Ensemble, Azerbaijan Cultural Center Folk Dance Ensemble, Uzbek Culture Group took part. Also within the scope of the Festival, famous names such as Serkan Çağrı, Sedat Anar, Mazhar Alanson and Kırac met with their fans.

At the 6th Ethnosport Culture Festival, participants had the opportunity to participate in many workshops such as marbling, recycling and wood burning, and had the chance to watch traditional athletes from Turkey and around the world.
